Covid-19 update

In line with recommendations from the National Public Health Emergency Team, it has been agreed that from Monday 27th Sep, automatic contact tracing of asymptomatic close contacts in Primary Education settings and others is no longer recommended. (under 13)

This means that children under 13 years who are identified as close contacts and who are asymptomatic will no longer be routinely required to restrict their movements.

We are asking you to continue to be vigilant of any symptoms of Covid-19 and to keep your child out of school if any symptoms exist.
